The Bradley Brothers' Legacy

In 1903, Lynde and Harry Bradley established a new business in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. It took courage and confidence for them to risk resources in a new venture, based only on their judgment of what was and their vision of what could be. The Bradleys' confidence was bolstered by the knowledge that in America, not only were they free to start a business, they could also begin again if they failed. The Bradleys, however, would not fail. Their business grew to become the internationally recognized Allen-Bradley Company.

When the Allen-Bradley Company was acquired by Rockwell International Corporation in 1985, a significant portion of the proceeds was dedicated to establishing The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation. Although it has no direct ties to the Allen-Bradley Company, the purpose of the Foundation is to commemorate Lynde and Harry Bradley by preserving and extending the principles and philosophy by which they lived and upon which they built their company. As their efforts succeeded, their business grew and eventually extended far beyond its Milwaukee headquarters. Lynde and Harry Bradley remained devoted to the city where they began their enterprise and in which they lived and worked for so many years. The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation is proud to continue its commitment to improving the quality of life in the Milwaukee metropolitan area and throughout Wisconsin.

The Bradleys lived and worked according to several philosophical principles. They believed that, over time, the consequences of ideas were more decisive than the force of political or economic movements. They recognized the interdependence of human endeavors – cultural, educational, philosophical, economic – and they rejected exclusionary emphasis on any single element. The brothers had an abiding belief in the dignity and decency of each person. They felt that only in an environment of political and economic freedom could individuals develop their talents, hone their skills and intellects, and contribute to the improvement of the human condition. The success of the Allen-Bradley Company stands as eloquent testimony to the enduring quality of these principles.

The Bradley Brothers were committed to preserving and defending the tradition of free, representative government and private enterprise that has also enabled the American nation and, in a larger sense, the entire Western world to flourish intellectually and economically. The Bradleys believed that the good society is a free society. The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation envisions a nation invigorated by the principles and institutions that uphold our unalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. Its mission is to restore, strengthen and protect the principles and institutions of American exceptionalism. Its programs are guided by the following principles: fidelity to the Constitution, with its principles of limited government, federalism, separation of powers, and individual liberties; commitment to free markets that allow for private enterprise, entrepreneurship and voluntary exchange within the rule of law; commitment to the fundamental institutions of civil society that cultivate individuals capable of self-governance; and dedication to the formation of informed and capable citizens.

Grantmaking Policies & Application Process

The program's priority giving areas and funding decisions of The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation are the responsibility of its Board of Directors. The Foundation's grantmaking policies and priorities may be modified at the Board's discretion.

The Foundation –

- can only support organizations that are exempt from Federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and publicly supported under Section 509(a)(1), (2), or (3);
- cannot provide grants to individuals;
- will not fund unspecified overhead costs;
- considers requests from religious organizations only when the impact of the project extends into the broader community; and
- requires grantees to provide periodic progress reports.

Application Procedure

The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation accepts Letters of Inquiry and Proposals on an ongoing basis.

Letters of Inquiry should be brief explanations about the organization and project to be supported. If the project falls within the Foundation's current program interests, a proposal may be invited.

Proposals are more extensive and should include:

- A thorough description of the project, its objectives and significance, and the qualifications and roles of participants.
- An organizational budget, a project budget, a specific request, and supporting documentation.
- A copy of the organization's Internal Revenue Service tax determination letter. The Foundation can only support organizations that are tax-exempt under Sections 501(c)(3) and 509(a), respectively, of the Internal Revenue Code.

All requests are reviewed by the Foundation's Program staff, but all grantmaking authority rests with the Board of Directors.

- The Board of Directors currently meets four times a year.
- Every effort is made to review proposals for the next scheduled Board meeting, but Board consideration may be deferred to gather more information.
- Many worthwhile projects do not fall within the Foundation's program interests or the scope of its annual budget.
- Numerous demands on the Foundation's resources also limit grant size and its ability to make extended commitments.

The Bradley Prizes



2017 Bradley Prizes Award Recipients

The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation awarded its 2017 Bradley Prizes to scholar and author Peter Berkowitz, public intellectual Christopher DeMuth, legal scholar Philip Hamburger, and economist Walter Williams in an inspiring and entertaining ceremony at Sidney Harmon Hall, followed by a gala reception at the National Building Museum. The \$250,000 prizes recognize and celebrate the honorees' achievements in areas consistent with the Foundation's mission.

Peter Berkowitz is the Tad and Dianne Taube Senior Fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University. He serves as dean of students for the Hertog Political Studies Program and for The Public Interest Fellowship and teaches for the Tikvah Fund in the United States and in Israel. Dr. Berkowitz is the author of *Constitutional Conservatism: Liberty, Self-Government, and Political Moderation*; *Israel and the Struggle over the International Laws of War*; *Virtue and the Making of Modern Liberalism*; and *Nietzsche: The Ethics of an Immoralist*. A leading public intellectual, Dr. Berkowitz is a contributor at *RealClearPolitics* and has written hundreds of articles, essays, and reviews on a range of subjects for both scholarly journals and the popular press. Dr. Berkowitz has led seminars on the principles of freedom and the American constitutional tradition for foreign students. From 1999 to 2006, he taught constitutional law and jurisprudence at George Mason University School of Law. From 1990 to 1999, he taught political philosophy in the department of government at Harvard University. Dr. Berkowitz holds a J.D. and a Ph.D. in political science from Yale University; an M.A. in philosophy from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem; and a B.A. in English literature from Swarthmore College.

Christopher DeMuth is a distinguished fellow at the Hudson Institute in Washington, D.C. He was president of the American Enterprise Institute for Public Policy Research from 1986 to 2008 and D.C. Searle Senior Fellow at AEI from 2009 to 2011. Mr. DeMuth graduated from The Lawrenceville School, Harvard College, and the University of Chicago Law School. He served two tours in government as staff assistant to President Richard Nixon from 1969 to 1970. During President Ronald Reagan's first term, he was administrator for information and regulatory affairs in the Office of Management and Budget and executive director of the Presidential Task Force on Regulatory Relief. From 1977 to 1981, Mr. DeMuth taught at Harvard's Kennedy School of Government and directed the Harvard Faculty Project on Regulation. He practiced law with Sidley & Austin in Chicago and the Consolidated Rail Corporation in Philadelphia. In addition, Mr. DeMuth has been an economic consultant with Lexicon, Inc. and was publisher and editor-in-chief of *Regulation* magazine in 1986. He is chairman of the AHA Foundation, co-chairman of the Board of Visitors of The Federalist Society, and a senior fellow of Scalia Law School's Center for the Study of the Administrative State. His writings have appeared in numerous academic publications, newspapers, and opinion magazines.

Philip Hamburger is the Maurice and Hilda Friedman Professor of Law at Columbia Law School. He was the John P. Wilson Professor at the University of Chicago Law School, where he was the Director of the Bigelow Program and the Legal History Program. Earlier, Professor Hamburger was the Oswald Symyster Colclough Research Professor at George Washington University Law School and a professor at the University of Connecticut Law School. He has been a Visiting Professor at the University of Virginia Law School and at Northwestern Law School, where he was the Jack N. Pritzker

Distinguished Visiting Professor of Law. He practiced business and corporate tax law. Professor Hamburger writes on religious liberty, freedom of speech and the press, judicial office, administrative power, and other questions of constitutional law and its history. He is the author of *Separation of Church and State*; *Law and Judicial Duty*; and *Is Administrative Law Unlawful?* His recent articles include: *Chevron Bias*; *Equality and Exclusion: How Exclusion from the Political Process Renders Religious Liberty Unequal*; *Inversion of Rights and Power*; *The Censorship You've Never Heard Of*; and *Unconstitutional Conditions: The Irrelevance of Consent*. Professor Hamburger has twice received the Sutherland Prize for contributions to English legal history and has been awarded the Henry Paolucci - Walter Bagehot Book Award and the Hayek Book Prize.

Walter E. Williams has served on the faculty of George Mason University as the John M. Olin Distinguished Professor of Economics since 1980. He also served on the faculties of Los Angeles City College; California State University Los Angeles; Temple University; and Grove City College. Dr. Williams is the author of over 150 articles which have appeared in scholarly journals and popular publications. He is also the author of ten books, including: *America: The State Against Blacks*, which was made into the PBS documentary *Good Intentions*; *Do the Right Thing: The People's Economist Speaks*; *Race and Economics: How Much Can Be Blamed on Discrimination?*; and *Up From the Projects: An Autobiography*, which was made into the PBS documentary *Suffer No Fools*. Dr. Williams writes a nationally syndicated column carried by 140 newspapers and several websites. He has made television appearances on *Nightline*; *Firing Line*; *Face the Nation*; Milton Friedman's *Free to Choose*; *Crossfire*; *MacNeil/Lehrer Newshour*; and *Wall Street Week*. Dr. Williams was a regular commentator for CNBC's *Nightly Business Report*, and an occasional substitute host of *The Rush Limbaugh Show* for 20 years. Dr. Williams has received prestigious awards from the Fund for American Studies; Foundation for Economic Education; Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge; and Veterans of Foreign Wars. He has also received fellowships from the Hoover Institution and Ford Foundation. A member of the Mont Pelerin Society and American Economic Association, Dr. Williams holds a B.A. in economics from California State University, Los Angeles, and a Ph.D. in economics from UCLA.
