4th ANNUAL BRADLEY PRIZE CEREMONY

Prominent Civic Leaders, Academics to be Honored at Kennedy Center Event May 3

<u>Milwaukee, WI</u>— The Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation will award the Fourth Annual Bradley Prizes for outstanding achievement to prominent intellectuals and public servants on May 3 in Washington, D.C.

The 2007 Bradley Prize recipients are: **John Bolton,** former U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations; **Martin S. Feldstein**, George F. Baker Professor of Economics, Harvard University; **Abigail and Stephan Thernstrom**, Senior Fellows at the Manhattan Institute and **James Q. Wilson**, Ronald Reagan Professor of Public Policy at Pepperdine University. Each award carries a stipend of \$250,000.

FOX News Channel host and Washington Managing Editor **Brit Hume** will serve as Master of Ceremonies for the evening event. All four Bradley Prizes will be presented with the awards during a ceremony held at the **John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C. beginning at 7:30 p.m.**
